Class Rank is noted on the Official Transcript for the top quartile of the COM class at the end of the first two years.</p> <p>CLINICAL CLASS RANK Clinical Class Ranks are based on individual student scores for first attempts on each of the six core clerkships. If any component of the clerkship is repeated, the first attempt is used for ranking purposes. The core clerkships include Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics, Psychiatry, and Surgery.</p>
